Items Accepted at the Clean-Up:

Appliances, automotive batteries, tires, mattresses, furniture, carpeting, household fixtures, TVs, electronics, lawn mowers (all fluid must be drained), building materials, limbs & brush

Ramsey County will be collecting Household Hazardous Waste at this year's Spring Clean-Up.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Accepted:

Antifreeze, batteries (vehicle & rechargeable) fluorescent lamps, mercury items (thermostats, CFLs, thermometers), old gasoline, paint, paint stripper, thinner, old cell phones, pesticides, rat or mouse poison, aerosol spray cans, used motor oil, filters, wood preservatives, stains, weed killer solvents and propane tanks.

About Your Invoice:

- All County and State taxes and fees are included in the above rates.
- Bills not paid within 30 days will be charged a \$5 late fee.
- Bills not paid within 90 days will be turned over to the Township to be added to your property taxes.
- Recycling and yard waste services are itemized on your invoice because they are not subject to State tax or County fees.

Extra Charges:

- You may be charged for extra household refuse. The rate is \$2.50 per 30-gallon bag. To avoid this charge make sure your weekly service level is large enough for your home and put everything in your cart.
- Larger piles of construction debris or brush are priced at \$20 per cubic yard.

Services Provided to Residents:

(these **ARE** included in your monthly service rate)

- Weekly Trash pickup
- Every-other-week Recycling pickup
- Weekly yardwaste pickup (Apr 15 - Nov 30, weather permitting)
- Appliance, Electronics and Bulky Item pick-ups (3 per year)
- Spring clean-up drop-off day—set for June 17, 2017
- Christmas tree pick-up (during first 2 full weeks in January)

YARD WASTE Service

April 15 — Nov 30

Republic Services will pick-up your yard waste. Leave bagged yard waste at your curb on your trash & recycling day. **Yard waste must be in compostable bags—yard waste in standard plastic bags is prohibited by State law.**

Yard waste is collected from **April 15 thru November 30**, weather permitting.

Accepted in the yard waste service:
Leaves, grass clippings, garden debris, and bundled brush (no branch can be larger than 3 inches in diameter or longer than 5 feet, Bundles can not be larger than 20 inches in diameter). Yard waste must be separated from other trash and recycling.

Not accepted in the yard waste service:
Fruit, hay, straw, cornstalks, ashes, sod, over-sized brush and branches, dead animals, animal waste, lake weeds, lumber, dirt and rocks.

BULKY ITEM & APPLIANCE PICK- UP



Please call Republic Services ahead of time to arrange the pick-up. Three (3) free Appliance or Electronics pick-ups are allowed annually. Republic will pick-up other bulky-items for free, including:

- Mattresses or box springs
- Furniture (size & weight limits apply)
- Carpeting (rolls no larger than 4' long x 18" diameter)
- Small Household Fixtures (size & weight limits apply)
- Small push lawn mowers (all fluids must be drained)
- Limited building materials (bag or bundle under 30 lbs.)

Recycling Contamination:

Contamination causes big problems at the Recycling facility. Please rinse and remove all excess food. Do NOT include sharp objects, needles, packages that contain hazardous waste (such as motor oil). Do Not recycle fuel tanks or propane cylinders, no plastic bags, cords, rope or holiday lights, as they get tangled in the equipment. When in doubt, throw these items in the trash cart. Help make sure items are recycled.

RECYCLING GUIDE

No sorting is required in the Recycling. Place all recyclables loose in the same cart. Please do not put items inside plastic bags.

Recycling is picked up every other week.

Paper

RECYCLE

- Mail, office and school papers • Phonebooks
- Magazines, newspaper and inserts
- Shredded paper in closed paper bags



Boxes:

- Pop and beer boxes • Cereal, cracker, shoe and gift boxes
- Toothpaste, medication and other toiletry boxes
- All Cardboard

NO: Paper towel or toilet paper tubes • Napkins, paper plates or cups • Tissue or wrapping paper • Styrofoam

Cartons

RECYCLE

- Please Rinse all containers
- Milk Cartons • Juice boxes
 - Soup, broth and wine cartons



NO: Paper or Styrofoam egg cartons

Glass

RECYCLE

- Rinse and remove caps and lids
- Bottles and jars



NO: Window glass or mirrors • Ceramics or pottery • Drinking glasses or cookware

Metal

RECYCLE

- Rinse
- Food and beverage cans • small scrap metal
 - Decorative tins and pie tins



NO: Paint cans or containers that held hazardous substances such as paint thinner and automotive fluids • Aerosol cans • Aluminum foil and trays

Plastics

RECYCLE

- Rinse and leave caps ON plastic containers

Bottles and Jugs:

- Water, soda and juice bottles
- Milk and juice jugs
- Ketchup and salad dressing bottles
- Dishwashing liquids and detergent jugs
- Shampoo, soap and lotion bottles



Containers:

- Yogurt, pudding and fruit cups • margarine, cottage cheese, and other containers
- Transparent "To-Go" containers • Berries and other plastic produce containers

NO Plastic bags or film • NO Motor oil or antifreeze bottles
